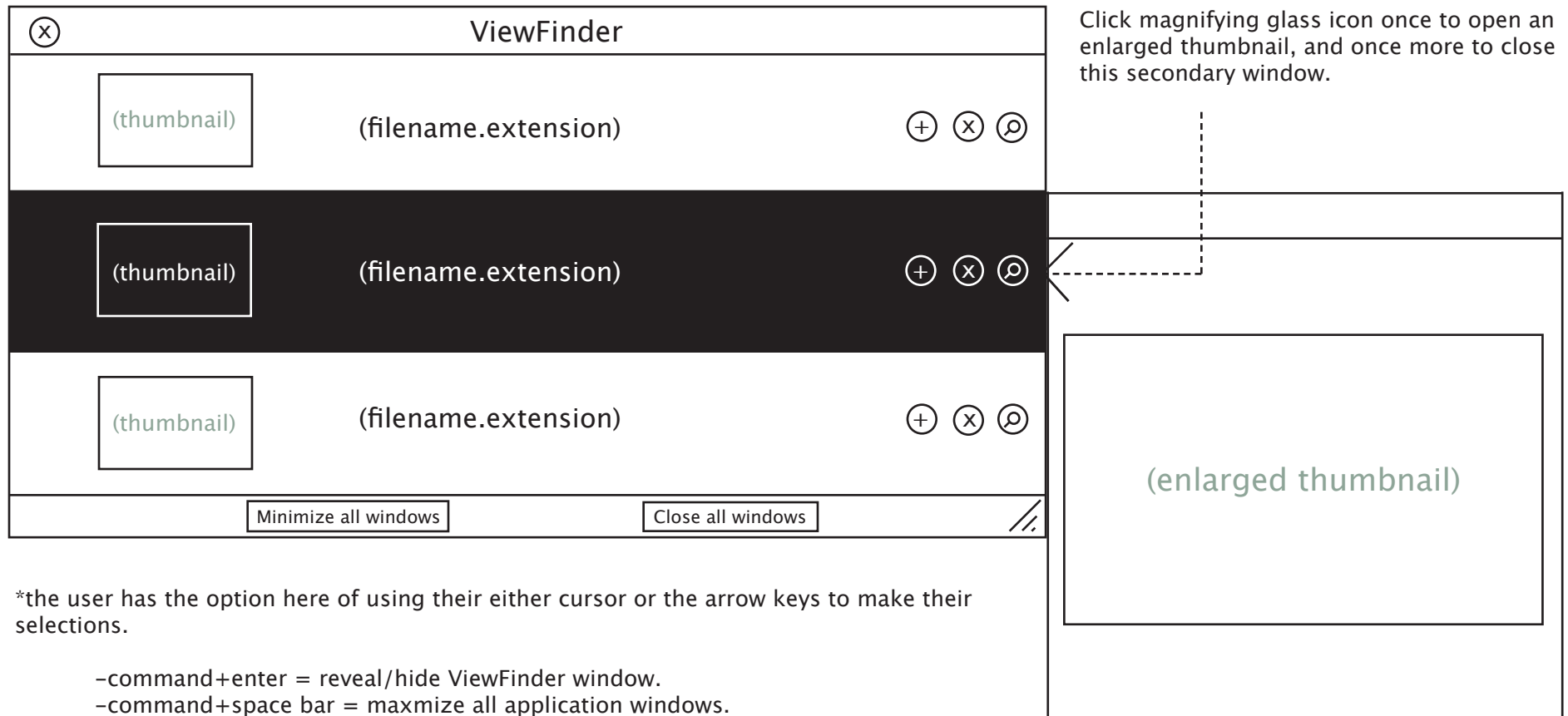


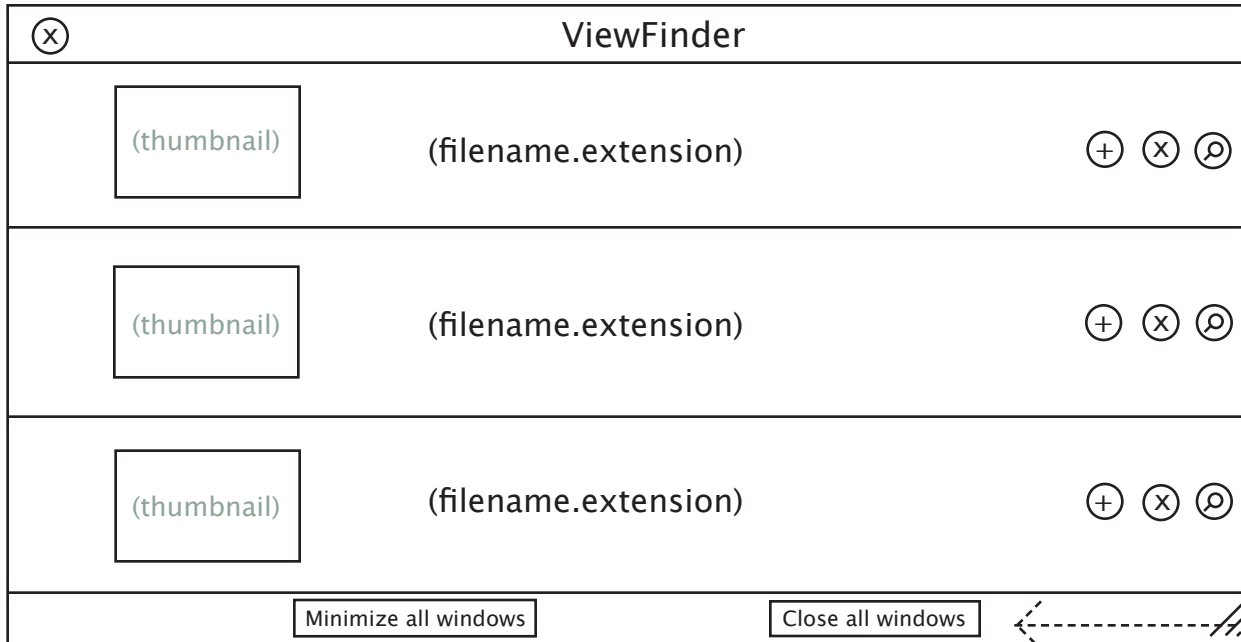
This is the default state of the ViewFinder “application”. When in use, the ViewFinder window is visible on the user’s desktop. When idle, ViewFinder hovers invisible on the desktop, appearing only when the user uses the keystroke, command + enter. This way, ViewFinder not only holds and manages minimized application windows, keeping them out of sight, but it also remains hidden itself until revealed.



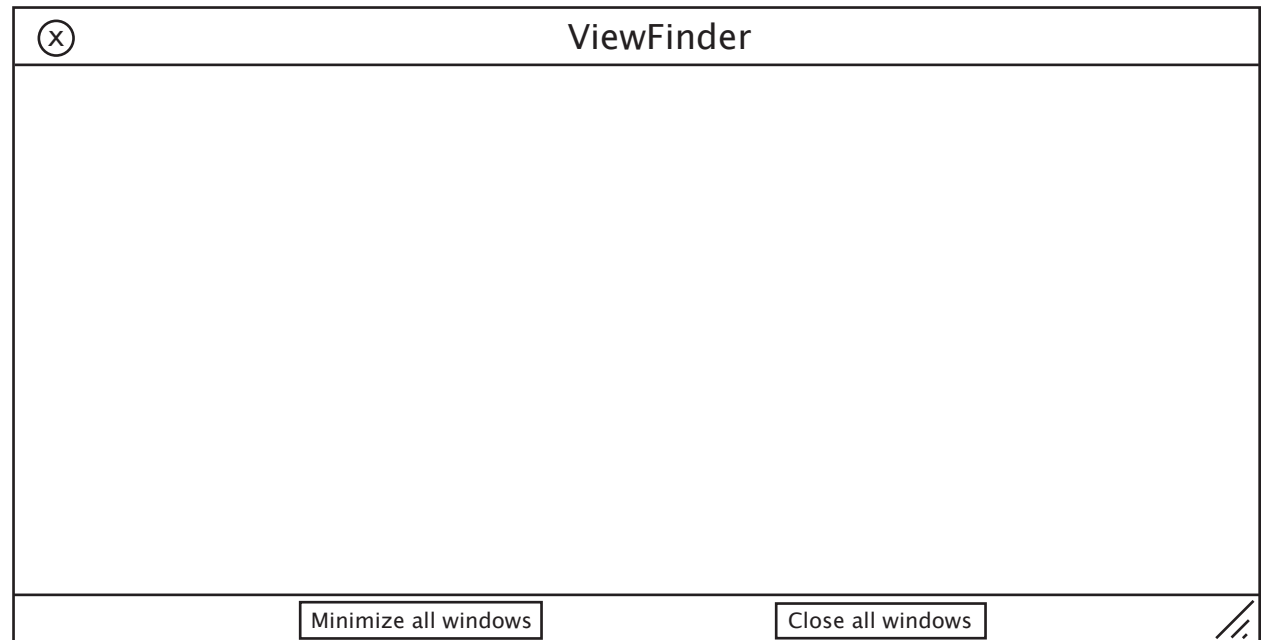
*the user has the option here of using their either cursor or the arrow keys to make their selections.

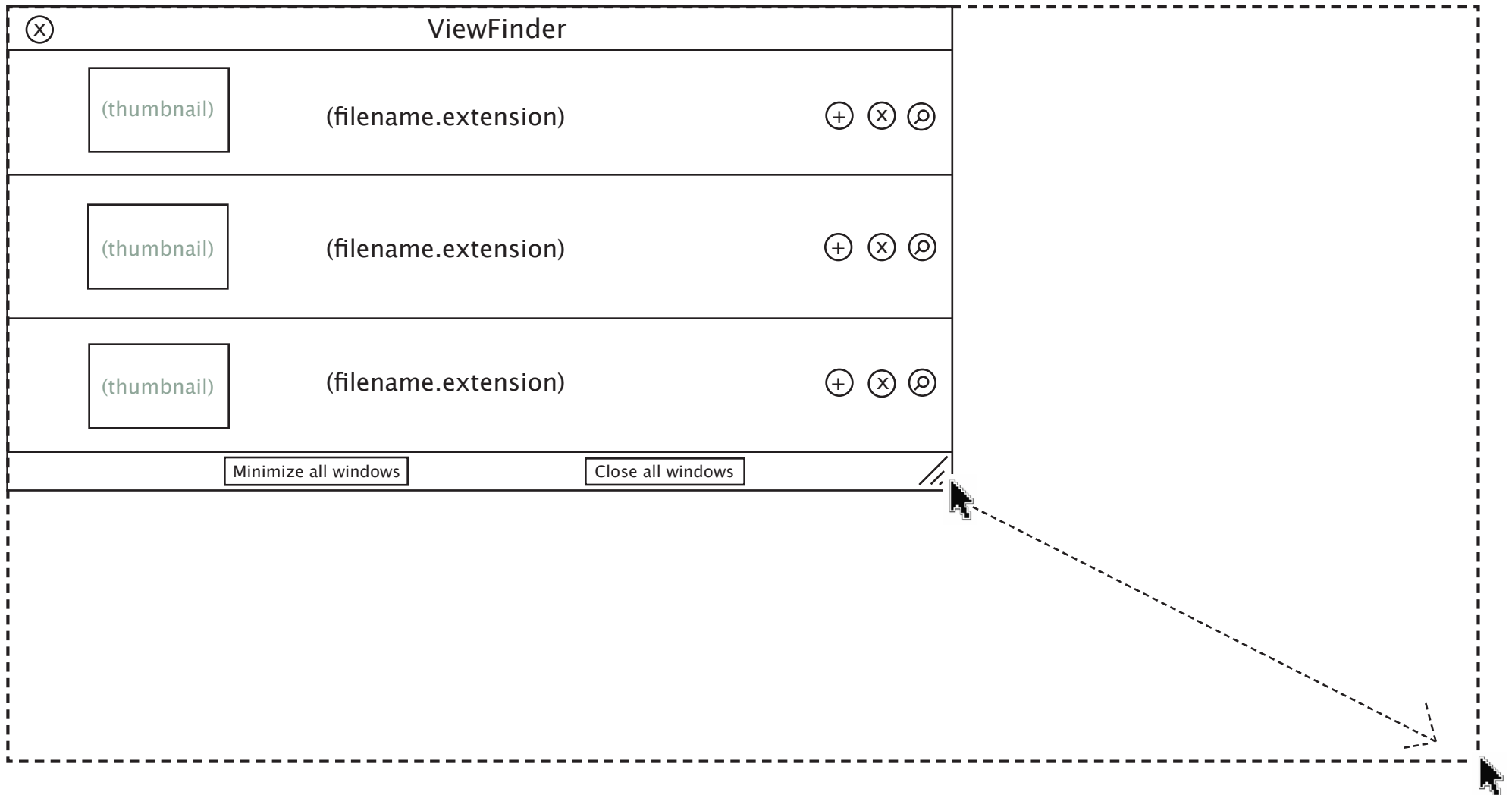
- command+enter = reveal/hide ViewFinder window.
- command+space bar = maximize all application windows.
- command+delete = close all application windows.
- up and down arrows = moves between thumbs in main window.
- right arrow = show enlarged thumbnail.
- left arrow = close enlarged thumbnail and move back to main window.

When the user selects a specific application window from the ViewFinder window they are given the option of clicking on the green "+" to maximize that app window to its full size, or they can click on the red "x" to close that app window, or the magnifying glass to enlarge the thumbnail to a larger viewing size to the left.



clicking here results in windows being handled by ViewFinder to close, both in ViewFinder's window, and on the desktop.





Here, the user can click and hold on the lower right hand corner to resize the ViewFinder window. Consequently, all interface components enlarge proportionally, including thumbnails and the enlarged thumbnail window.
